Steve Wilson, Texas State University-San Marcos

Steve Wilson has taught at Texas State University since 1987, and has been a member of TFA for over two decades. He has been active in faculty governance at Texas State, where he served as Faculty Senator for six years (until 2013), and has also been an active participant in many university committees focusing on faculty issues, most recently the Academic Freedom Committee and the President's Task Force on Internationalization. He has directed a study abroad program since 2000, participates in professional conferences all over the country, and always encourages his colleagues to join TFA. A professor of Creative Writing (Poetry) and U.S. Literature, he is the author of five collections of poetry -- the latest, *The Reaches,* appeared in 2019. Wilson is a Fellow of the Texas Institute of Letters. He has also taught abroad as a Senior Fulbright Scholar, in Romania (1994-95) and Slovenia (2002 and 2004).

Samir Igbal, University of Texas Rio Grande Valley

Dr. Samir Iqbal earned his Ph.D. from Purdue University, USA in 2007. He is a Professor at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley. Before this, he was a faculty at UT-Arlington for over a decade. He has published over 60 journal articles and presented at more than 100 conferences. He has been a Distinguished Lecturer for two IEEE Societies and has received many research, teaching, mentoring and service awards. He aspires to be working at the forefronts organizing Texas higher-ed faculty.

Israel Aguilar, University of Texas Rio Grande Valley

Dr. Israel Aguilar earned a B.A. and M.A. in English literature from the University of Texas at Brownsville. He also holds a Ph.D. in education with a major in school improvement from Texas State University-San Marcos. In addition, he holds Texas educator licensure in the following areas: superintendent, principal, and classroom teacher. Dr. Aguilar's professional experience include serving as a school administrator in Dallas, and as a teacher in Austin and Brownsville. He currently teaches in principal preparation at the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley.
